Boomer-Buckaroo joined our family early 2007 at 8 weeks old and immediately became our chief taster and poster boy! Boomer-Buckaroo is also a certified therapy dog through Love On A Leash, making regular visits to local health centers, hospitals, and senior centers. He loves swimming and riding quads on the beach, hiking, and playing football!

Roxy was 11 and an active therapy dog with *Love On A Leash* when diagnosed with inoperable cancer and nearly succumbed to the same poisoned pet food recalled in 2007. A lifetime of sensitive tummy issues completely disappeared with a renewed puppy-like energy upon switching her to fresh, whole food, and she enjoyed another 4 wonderful years before joining Hunter at the Rainbow Bridge.
