Continued US drought could cause problems for winter crops
 Overall drought conditions in the U.S. lower 48 states have held steady over the seven-day period ending October 2, with one-fifth of the total land area in extreme or exceptional drought, according to the U.S. Drought Monitor's weekly update of its drought map released on October 4, leading to worries that winter crops may be affected. Conditions have actually worsened in Iowa and Kansas.

China pork demand could lead to record corn imports
 If current trends in China's pork production and industrialization continue, the country's corn imports could approach 20 million metric tons per year within a five-year time frame, according to a report released by Rabobank's Food and Agribusiness Research and Advisory Group. China has recently been importing over 0.4 million metric tons of pork per year, in a world market with trade of less than 7 million metric tons per year.

Feed International: Identifying low-cost, high-quality piglet feeds
 When feed ingredient prices shoot up, discussions on revising commercial piglet feeds flare up in meeting rooms at most nutrition suppliers' headquarters. Even with rising ingredient costs, it still may be possible to reduce feed cost without resorting to low-quality raw materials.

Developed world told not to use human food in animal feed
 The developed world has been asked not to excessively use human food for animal feed or other non-human consumption purposes on the recommendation of agriculture ministers from eight developing countries, who gathered at a D-8 meeting in Indonesia on October 5. The request stemmed from discussion of the possibility of a global food shortage due to global warming and land conversion threats.

Ukraine corn harvest forecast cut to 19 million metric tons
 The Ukraine corn harvest forecast was cut on declining yields to 19 million metric tons from last month's estimate of 20 million metric tons by agriculture researcher UkrAgroConsult, according to a report. More than half of the corn is harvested, and yields are at 4.15 tons a hectare compared with 5.54 tons a hectare a year ago.

Feed International: Using pellet quality to improve broiler growth rate, feed conversion
 Poultry activity, or behavior, has not received as much research attention as other areas when considering performance. In our modern production environments, there has traditionally been little perceived economic value in understanding or monitoring bird behavior.
