



Life Cycle Analysis of MFiber

In 2020,

the Pet Sustainability Coalition facilitated a product Life Cycle Analysis (LCA) of MFiber. The goal of the LCA was to understand the environmental impacts of MFiber compared to Powdered Cellulose. Both are used as ingredients in pet food.





What is Miscanthus?

MFiber is a cellulose fiber from the perennial Miscanthus giganteus grass and is grown in the Midwest region of the United States.



What is Powdered Cellulose?

A pulp from a raw fibrous plant material, most typically wood from trees, that is mechanically and chemically cleaned, processed and disintegrated.

This LCA focused on the material and manufacturing phases of the life cycle

The LCA found the environmental impacts of MFiber are considerably less than Powdered Cellulose across all categories*:

Less Water Consumed






